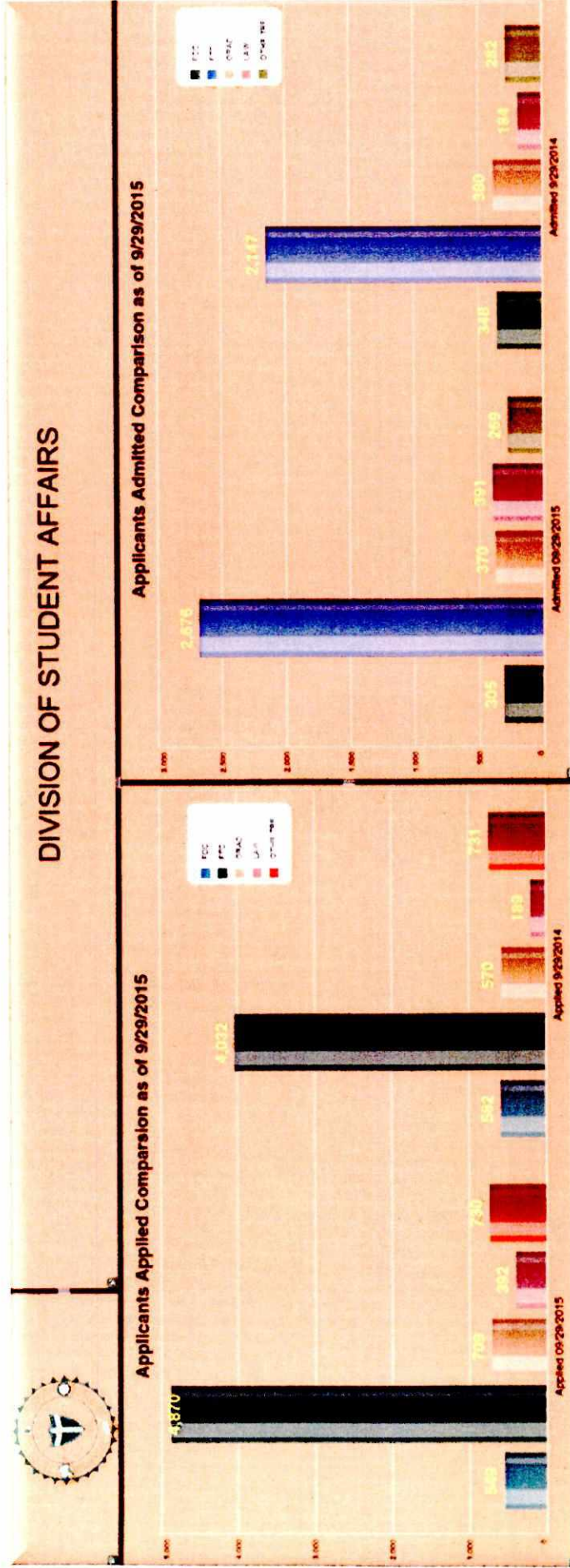

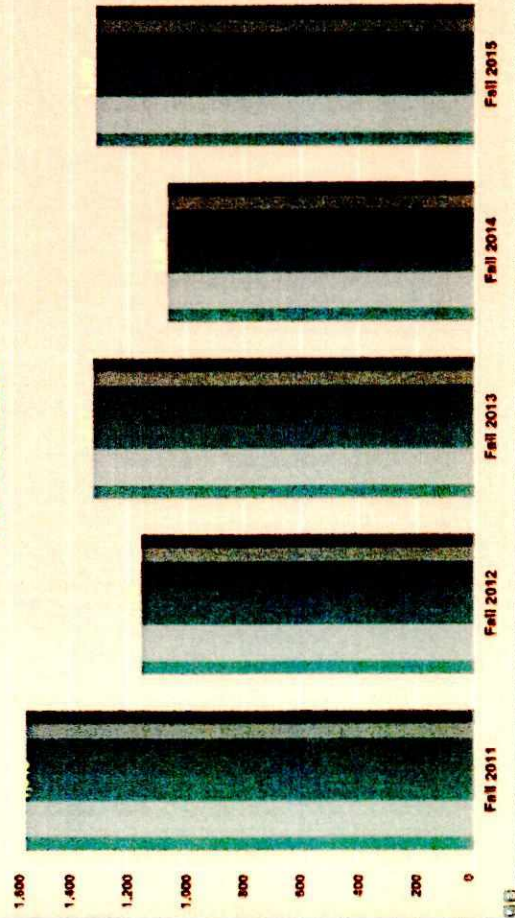

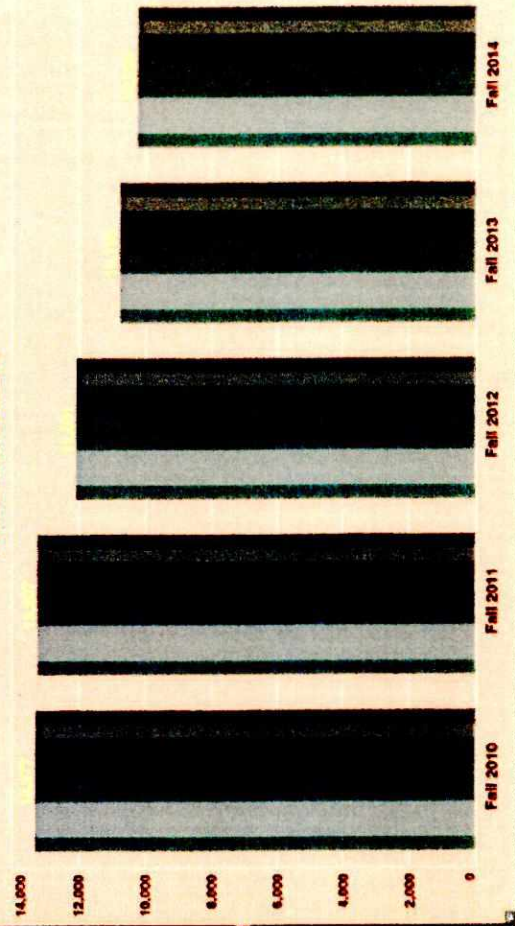

TOTAL ENROLLMENT

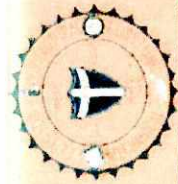

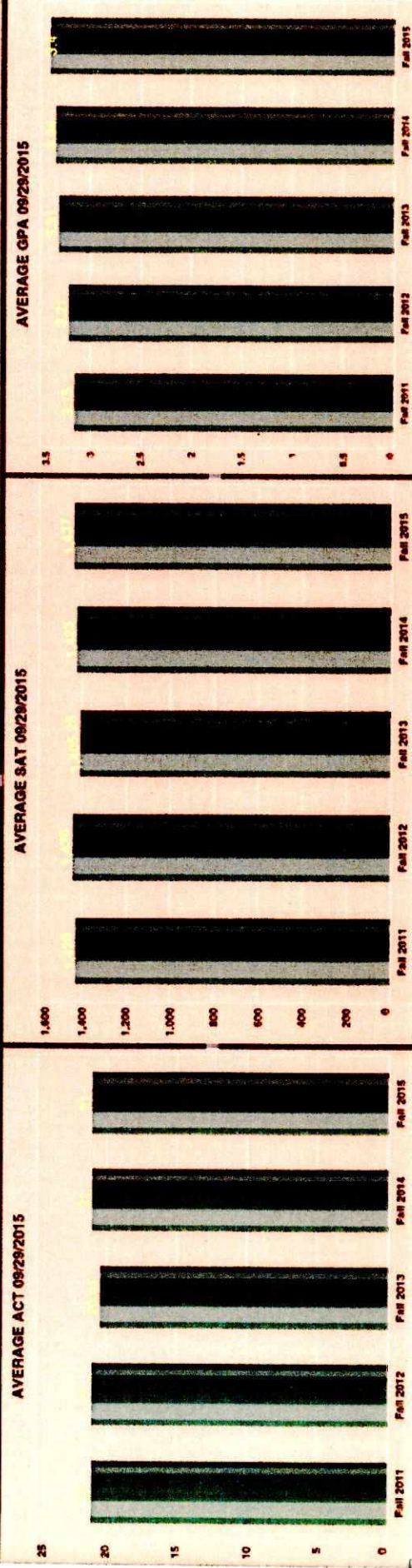

Hazing Prevention Initiatives

Division of Student Affairs

- Approximately 3250 students have taken the State mandated Online Hazing Course (the highest percentage of student body populations within the SUS)
- Six hazing prevention seminars were presented to clubs & organizations and individual presentations to both basketball teams and the residential directors & assistants during the Fall 2015 semester
- National Hazing Prevention Week was recognized September 21st – 25th
- The university is currently investigating four allegations of misconduct that could potentially be deemed as hazing – university leadership will continuously be updated concerning these allegations
- The Special Assistant for Anti-Hazing represented the university as a panelist for a panel on Hazing Prevention at the NASPA-FL drive in conference on October 16, 2015
