### Diagnostics



### 1. Year 1: Pre-Semester 1 Matriculation Preparedness

- Meet with faculty mentor.
- Faculty adapt instructional methods and content emphasis in syllabi

#### 2. Comprehensive Examination Failure:

- Ineligible for participation in clinical education, continued matriculation, promotion (from Year 1 to Year 2, and from Year 2 to Year 3), and graduation.
- Meet with the Student Progress Committee (SPC) to develop an individualized study plan for success.
- Program dismissal if the student fails twice.
- 3. Annual Graduation Exit Survey: Outcomes Committee analyzes reviewed at annual faculty retreat informing curricular and strategic plan changes.

# Faculty Development and Training

Seminars	Program faculty <b>attend seminars</b> conducted by the professional organization, FAMU faculty experts, and expert guest lecturers invited from other universities that address digital learning, contemporary teaching pedagogy and the design of courses by faculty.
Standard Syllabus Template	The Program Director (PD), Curriculum Committee and Faculty ensure a standard syllabus template is used by all for consistency and content mapped to the CAPTE standards and the NPTE Blueprint.
Assessment of Classroom Teaching Methods	PD assessment of classroom teaching methods ensure that faculty are employing active learning strategies that reinforce knowledge retention and clinical reasoning.
Active Learning Strategies	The University's Teaching and Learning Center provides support to increase the use of <b>active learning strategies</b> , which helps to ensure that the faculty meet contemporary program and curricular needs.
Certified Writers for the NPTE	Support will be provided for faculty to attend an FSBPT course to become <b>certified item writers for the NPTE</b> .
Annual Performance Appraisals	Annual Performance Appraisals ensure that the credentials of core and associated faculty are appropriate to meet the CAPTE standards and the needs of the program.
Faculty Peer Reviews	Faculty peer reviews include classroom teaching assessments and reviewing and improving the quality of course examination questions and syllabi.

## Peer Benchmarking



#### **Key Strategies/Best Practices**

- **1. Admissions**: GPA (cumulative, pre-requisite courses etc.) and GRE minimum standards
- 2. Curriculum:
  - Multiple opportunities across the curriculum for student to demonstrate competency (quizzes during each course, and comprehensive exams patterned after the NPTE).
  - NPTE preparatory resources and practice examinations.
  - Strong service-learning component: Faculty/student run clinic, community engagement.
- 3. Stringent student progression and performance policies.
  - No extra credit/assignments or multiple opportunities to pass examinations (George Washington U.).
- **4. Resources**: NPTE preparatory tools, classroom equipment and technological support reflecting contemporary PT practice.
- 5. Faculty
  - Longevity
  - NPTE item writers
  - Student engagement with the faculty outside of regular classroom, particularly when they are having trouble.
  - Peer reviews
- Assessment: Link course revisions to NPTE student outcomes.

Florida DPT Program Directors meet weekly (since COVID-9) to support each other and to discuss and share ideas via Zoom. The FAMU Director of Clinical Education is a member of the Florida Consortium of Clinical Educators, which meets regularly to address issues, ideas and logistical challenges surrounding clinical education practices.
