





2014 – 2017 Fall to Fall Year 1 Retention Rate






Graduation Rate Comparison



Hazing Prevention Initiatives

- Hazing continues to be a serious safety concern throughout U.S. Colleges & Universities.
- There have been an estimated twenty-one suspected hazing related deaths at U.S. Universities, since November 2011.
- In 2017, Penn State, LSU and FSU have all experienced the death of a student, deaths that are being investigated for possible hazing violations.





Hazing Prevention

We understand with high profile incidences of hazing, there will be renewed national attention concerning this issue – At FAMU, we remain diligent and steadfast in our mission to eradicate hazing, not just focusing on Greek letter organizations but focusing on a safe campus environment for all students.

FAMU currently has two open investigations to determine if university regulation 2.028 ("the antihazing regulation") has been violated

We have four Greek Letter Organizations conducting intake during the Fall 2017 Semester. Hazing prevention and campus safety, educational sessions were held with each organization individually.

We also conducted a campus wide hazing prevention seminar on September 7, 2017 (two additional seminars were canceled due to storm related university closings)

TRAININGS FOR GREEK ORGS; CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS & ADVISORS; ROTC; MUSIC DEPT; and ATHLETICS continue and are scheduled for Spring 2018 as well.


The SUS sponsored "HAZING PREVENTION ONLINE MODULE" IS STILL BEING PROMOTED:




