FALL 2023 Admissions Snapshot Other Updates

Admissions

- Admitted students must pay enrollment deposit before applying for housing
- Admissions will institute a waitlist for applicants
- Waitlist communication plan is being developed
- FSC enrollment is down across the system

Housing

- Housing Portal opened December 1st solely for new admits
- Returning student portal window opened February 1st
- Assignments are being made as payments are received
- Increased number of bed spaces for freshman

Financial Aid

DEFINITIONS

- **AWARDING** - Process by which student eligibility is determined and award allocations set.
- **DISBURSEMNT** - Process by which funds are applied against students' charges. Our disbursement process begin the week after add/drop and is in incumbent on students' being marked attending in all classes.
- **Refunds/Net Checks** – This occurs when the total amounts of aid (federal, state, institutional, private) exceed the total charges for any payment period (term). Refunds are processed by Student Accounts on Mondays and Wednesdays.

INVESTIGATIONS

FLORIDA A&M UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1887 as the State Normal College for Colored Students, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU) is the only historically state supported educational facility for African Americans in Florida. It has always been co-educational. In 1890, the second Morrill Act was passed. This enabled the school to become the Black Land Grant College for the State of Florida. In 1891, the college was moved from its original location west of town to its present location which was once the site of "Highwood," Territorial Governor W.P. Duval's slave plantation. The school was known as Florida A&M College from 1909 until 1953 when it attained university status.
