PAST PERFORMANCE

- The 2023 annual pass rate is 82.46% which is within 10% of the National average.
- FAMU School of Nursing produces more than 80 bachelor's and master's level nursing graduates each year with most BSN and MSN students obtaining their first jobs postgraduation in Florida.
- FAMU School of Nursing was successful in securing over \$50,000 in faculty research grants from 2020-2023. Additionally, Pipeline scholarship grants exceeded 2.5M from 2022-2024.
